

New Major – Philosophy

Philosophy provides students with an understanding of the principles, methods, and areas of application of contemporary philosophy. Philosophers study conceptual questions within and between the humanities, arts and sciences: What is freedom? What is justice? What is the relation between mind and brain? Philosophy at UC Merced combines a traditional curriculum with an emphasis on these interdisciplinary linkages. Because of this, students should be able to use their training in philosophy to complement their other coursework and to identify connections between their various areas of study.




New Minor – World Heritage

The World Heritage minor focuses on the natural heritage and cultural legacy of the human past, and how it is reflected today in places, landscapes, and intangible aspects of our cultures, including traditions, oral histories, song, music, dance, drama, skills, cuisine, crafts, and festivals. This program offers coursework and applied labs in:

- Studying and mapping monuments
- Buildings
- Managing cultural and natural heritage sites and landscapes using Remote Sensing, 3D visualization technologies, Geographic Information Systems, and digital data curation.


Students may minor in World Heritage to strengthen their skills in the documentation, analysis, interpretation, visualization, and management of heritage places and resources with an emphasis in either cultural and/or natural attributes. The program prepares students for heritage careers in historic preservation, heritage tourism, cultural and natural resource management, and global policies on heritage or a combination of such disciplinary approaches.


Change of Major/Minor Policy

- Students are not permitted to change majors or add a minor(s) until their second semester
- Students must have a cumulative GPA of a 2.0 or higher
- Students must have completed less than 90 units
- Transfer students who wish to change their major within SSHA must meet the major admission criteria and major/minor policy at the time they wish to change their major
 - If you are thinking of changing your major, please speak to an advisor today
- Must fill out a <u>Change of Major</u> or <u>Change of Minor</u> form to be approved by the Dean of the School to which the major or minor is housed in








Running a Degree Audit using MyDegreePath



- Includes all of your completed, in-progress and outstanding degree requirements
- After making changes to your courses (adding/dropping) it is recommended you run an audit to see how your changes reflect on your degree audit



Academic Planning: How to Get Assistance

STEP 1 → Research

- Utilize academic resources
 - SSHA Advising Website
 - MyDegreePath
 - Course Schedule

STEP 2 → Personalize and Plan

- Prepare your course options
- Identify academic concerns
- Explore major/minor options
- Make decisions about the upcoming semester

STEP 3 → Meet With an Advisor

- Items to bring to the meeting: current copy of audit and choice of courses
- Advisors help with course selection, not creating schedules

- Students emailing their advisor should expect a response within 1-2 business days


Appointments vs. Walk-Ins

- Walk-in hours are held for a specific amount of time every week; days and times will always be posted on the homepage of the SSHA Advising website





Responsibilities of an Advisee

- Follow through and accept responsibility for all decisions

- Know your major requirements, course prerequisites and class sequencing
- Review course syllabi, complete assignments and attend class


